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# SOUTHERN IOWA FAIRGROUND RULES

All motorized wheelchairs will be accepted and permitted upon the grounds.

Golf carts, ATVs, Rangers and similar vehicles of conveyances shall be limited to fair personnel, staff & antique tractor area workers. The Board of Directors and Superintendents will use all diligence to ensure the safety of articles after their arrival but will not be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur. Exhibitors must give personal attention to the property and immediately preceding the close of the fair, take charge of the same.
- 4) NO EXHIBITOR IS TO MAKE COMMENT DURING THE JUDGING. If so, exhibits will be disqualified. Any questions may be presented at close of judging.
- 5) Persons interested directly in the premiums in any department must not act as a judge in that department. The Association will supply expert judges for each department as far as possible.
- 6) On Monday after 4:00pm you will be charged a parking fee. Monday & Saturday you will have to park in the regular parking lot. This applies to everyone.

- 14. Younger exhibitor classes 24-27 will be judged first.
